1. This statement supplements my earlier statement ^{dated 12/11/14} and the evidence I gave to the Royal Commission on 19 November 2014.
 2. The matters I wish to make a further statement in relation to, appear below.
 3. Following my giving evidence concerning my involvement in the Vietnam War, including making comments about the activities of Vietnam veterans, I wish to make it plain that I do not have anything but admiration for those who went to fight in Vietnam. Most of them came back with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder. Some of them are still good friends of mine.
 4. The other matter which I wish to draw the Commission's attention to is that in the 1960s there was a song which other students checked ^{about} ~~at~~ ^{AOE} ~~REDACTED~~urchins students, the word

"Get a woman, get a woman, get a woman
if you can; if you can't get a woman get a
Dutchman man."

In my view, ~~the nature~~ ^{and extent} this shows the nature
of the rumours that surrounded Dutchman's
School, even back in the 1960s.

5. In light of the words of the song and the
extent and nature of the rumours which
surrounded the Dutchman School from at
least the 1960s, it is ludicrous to suggest
that those in charge of the Dutchman School
had no evidence of inappropriate sexual
behaviour taking place between some teachers
of the school and some students. To continue
to make those denials now is atrocious.
