1. This statement made by me accurately sets out the evidence that I am prepared to give to the Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse. The statement is true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.
2. My full name is Faye Lorraine Chandley. I am 69 years old.
3. I graduated from Frankston Teacher's College in 1965. I held several teaching positions, including at state schools in Geelong and Darwin, Northern Territory, and St Mary's Catholic Primary School in Dandenong, Victoria. I also spent time working in special education training and curriculum development roles, including at St John's Catholic College in Dandenong and with the Victorian Department of Health. I also hold Curriculum Administration and Student Wellbeing qualifications from the State College of Victoria and University of Melbourne respectively.
4. In 1983, I returned to St Mary's primary school as the acting principal. I was appointed principal in 1984 and continued in that role until January 1994.
5. On 15 July 1987, Julie Stewart came to my office and we had a conversation. I made notes of that conversation at the time. I confirm that the document shown to me and marked IND.0306.001.0085 constitutes those notes. I can confirm the abbreviations

used in the notes as J for Julie; Mo for Julie Stewart's mother; Fa for Julie Stewart's father; D or D'ton for Doveton; F for Father Searson; conf. for confessional; Mr S for Mr Graeme Sleeman; S.M. for St Mary's; Miss B for Julie Stewart's then classroom teacher; A.S.C. for Administrative Services Consultant; C.E.O. for Catholic Education Office; W.S. for Wantirna South. I also sometimes use F initially or Faye to refer to myself in the notes.

6. My notes also refer to a subsequent discussion with Father Julian Langridge who was the Acting Parish Priest. Father Anthony Guelen was the Parish Priest but he was on leave at the time.
7. When Father Guelen returned, I am not sure of the exact date, I asked him for advice and follow-up action about Julie Stewart. He checked with 'headquarters'. 'Headquarters' were his words. Father Guelen came back to me and said 'It's a police matter, Faye.'
