Good Evening Sir,

It has now been one month since my suspension and three weeks since the matter was referred to QPOL, from whom I have heard nothing. I have two questions at this stage;

1. Is my suspension to be open-ended and indefinite based on how long it takes QPOL to investigate (if they investigate)? What if this is going to take some time? How long can I be suspended for 'without prejudice' before I start to be disadvantaged by the situation?

2. Since the matter has been referred to QPOL, am I eligible for legal aid or assistance from the AAFC?

Dear FLTLT (AAFC) Oakley,

I have received this evening a complaint alleging you may have engaged in unacceptable conduct with a cadet.

The allegation, if proven, would indicate you have contravened the code of conduct.

The matter is now the subject of an investigation by the AAFC.

While the investigation is proceeding, and *without prejudice*, I am suspending you from your appointment as an Officer of Cadets.

I stress that no finding of guilt attaches to my decision to suspend you.

You are to be offered all appropriate support during your period of suspension.

In particular, you are encouraged to call upon the services of the Wing Psychologist, FLTLT (AAFC) Bob Hajduczuk.
