<i>Aged Care Act 1997 (Cwlth)</i>	Enables the Minister to make up to 25 sets of Principles that are required or permitted under the Act, or that the Minister considers are necessary or convenient to carry out or give effect to a Part or Section of the Act.
<i>Animal Care and Protection Act 2001 (Qld)</i>	Promotes the responsible care and use of animals. It places a legal duty of care on people in charge of animals to meet those animals' needs in an appropriate way.
<i>Anti-Discrimination Act 1977 (NSW)</i>	<p>Grounds of unlawful discrimination Race, (including colour, nationality and national or ethnic origin), sex (including pregnancy), marital status, disability, homosexuality, age (compulsory retirement only), transgender, carer's responsibility.</p> <p>Other unlawful conduct Sexual harassment; vilification on the basis of race, homosexuality, transgender and HIV/AIDS status.</p> <p>Areas covered: Employment; partnerships; trade unions; qualifying bodies; employment agencies; education; access to places and vehicles; provision of goods and services; accommodation; registered clubs.</p>
<i>Anti-Discrimination Act 1991 (QLD)</i>	<p>Grounds of unlawful discrimination Sex, relationship status, pregnancy, parental status, breast feeding (goods and services only), race, age, physical impairment, religion, political belief or activity, trade union activity, lawful sexual activity, gender identity, sexuality, family responsibilities, or association with a person who has any of these attributes.</p> <p>Other unlawful conduct Sexual harassment</p> <p>Areas covered: Work and work-related; education; goods and services; superannuation and insurance; disposal of land; accommodation; club membership; administration of state laws and programs; local government; existing partnership and in pre-partnership.</p>
<i>Australian Human Rights Commission Act 1986 (Cwlth)</i>	Relevant to breaches of human rights by any Commonwealth body or agency and discrimination in employment on the basis of race, colour, sex, religion, political opinion, national extraction, social origin, age, medical record, criminal record, marital status,

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	impairment, disability, nationality, sexual preference, trade union activity. Areas covered: Commonwealth body or agency; employment and occupation.
Building Act 1975 (Qld)	Safety during building, swimming pool legislation and budget accommodation fire safety.

<i>Child Protection (Working with Children) Act 2012 (NSW)</i>	Details safety screening and risk management in NSW for children
<i>Child Protection Act 1999 (Qld)</i>	Details safety screening and risk management in Queensland for children
<i>Children and Young Persons (Care and Protection) Act 1998 (NSW)</i>	About the child protection system in NSW. It explains how children and young people, who are at risk or being abused, should be cared for in NSW and how vulnerable families should be helped. Leaving a child in a car. Tattoo & body piercing.
<i>Civil and Administrative Act 2013 (NSW)</i>	Sets out provisions related to establishing the Tribunal, how proceedings are commenced, procedures and powers of the Tribunal, and the appointment of members.
<i>Classification of Publications Act 1991 (Qld)</i>	Enforces classification laws
<i>Commission for Children and Young People Act 1998 (NSW)</i>	The NSW Commission for Children and Young People administers this Act. The Commission reports directly to the NSW Parliament, and the Committee on Children and Young People oversees their work. The Commission is responsible for administering the Working with Children Check for employees working directly with children and young people.
<i>Community Services (Complaints Appeals and Monitoring) Act (CAMA) (1993)(NSW)</i>	CAMA provides for an independent mechanism to investigate complaints in relation to the provision of community services in NSW. The Act provides for the establishment of the Community Services Commission, an independent tribunal which monitors and investigates complaints about services provided through the NSW Department of Community Services. The Community Services Commission is unique to NSW and provides an added mechanism to ensure that the rights of people with disabilities are upheld. The Commission has a number of roles which include: the investigation and conciliation of complaints; the monitoring of standards and patterns of complaints; reviewing the situation of children and adults in care; providing education and community development; co-

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	ordination of the Community Visitors Scheme; and to provide systemic advocacy. Reviewing of deaths.
Control of work-related exposure to hepatitis and HIV (blood-borne) viruses: Code of practice - October 2004 (NSW)	This Code of Practice provides practical guidance to employers and workers on the suitable methods to control risks in blood-borne viruses.
<i>Coroners Act 2003 (Qld)</i>	Details the reporting requirements after the death of a service user
<i>Copyright Act 1968 (Cwlth)</i>	Defines the legally enforceable rights of creators of creative and artistic works
<i>Corporations Act 2001 (Cwlth)</i>	Details governance legislation e.g. Board procedures, company powers and how they are executed, changing the name of a business, insurance requirements, procedures related to members and AGMs, financial reporting and confidentiality.
<i>Crimes Act 1900 (NSW)</i>	Details criminal offences including children in cars, the age of consent for sexual interactions.
<i>Crimes Amendment (Computer Offences) Act 2001 (NSW)</i>	Details criminal offences related to computer offences.
<i>Criminal Code Act 1899 (Qld)</i>	Details criminal offences including the age of consent for anal sex (referred to as sodomy in legislation), the legal age for engaging in sexual activities.
<i>Criminal Code Act 1995</i>	Details criminal offences including criminal responsibility (e.g. negligence), theft and property offences, computer and financial offences and offences against humanity e.g. rape.
<i>Defamation Act 2005 (NSW)</i>	Governs the law of defamation in NSW.
<i>Defamation Act 2005 (Qld)</i>	Governs the law of defamation in Queensland. The 2005 Act will apply to defamatory matter published after 1 January 2006. If the defamation occurred prior to 1 January 2006, the 1889 Act will apply.
<i>Department of Social Services's Policy 2012 - Cypersafety</i>	Publicly funded service providers are required to take reasonable steps to protect their clients, and particularly children, from the risks of harmful content and harmful or inappropriate use of computers and digital technology, where the funding recipient's computers and other technology are supported through public funding. Reasonable steps to protect may include having a policy in place about appropriate use of

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	computers and cybersafety protection for staff and clients, filters installed, audits and providing information and/or training to staff and clients about cybersafety.
<i>Disability Discrimination Act 1992 (Cwlth)</i>	Provides protection for everyone in Australia against discrimination based on disability. It encourages everyone to be involved in implementing the Act and to share in the overall benefits to the community and the economy that flow from participation by the widest range of people.
<i>Disability Inclusion Act 2014 (NSW)</i>	<p>The Act aims to recognise the human rights of people with disability and to help people move to the new funding arrangements under the National Disability Insurance Scheme.</p> <p>The Act:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • makes it clear that people with disability have the same human rights as other people • promotes the inclusion of people with disability by requiring government departments and local councils to engage in disability inclusion action planning • supports people with disability to exercise choice and control through individualised funding wherever possible • provides safeguards for people accessing NSW funded disability supports and services, including new employment screening requirements and the need for disability accommodation providers to report abuse or neglect of people with disability to the Ombudsman.
<i>Disability Services Act 1986 (Cwlth)</i>	The Commonwealth Disability Services Act (1986) aims to ensure that people with disabilities receive the services necessary to maximise their full potential, and further, to ensure that people with disabilities have the same rights as other members of the community. The Act is based upon a series of principles and objectives which define service quality and outcomes. These principles and objectives include such things as: the right for respect for an individual's human worth and dignity; the right to pursue grievances; the right to participate in the decisions that affect one's life; the right to appropriate support services; and, the right to the least restrictive alternative (the option which offers the greatest degree of personal freedom).
<i>Disability Services Act 2006 (Qld)</i>	Provides the foundation for promoting the rights of people with a disability, increasing their wellbeing and encouraging their participation in the life of the community. It includes

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	measures to safeguard the rights and safety of people with a disability and combines with existing systems to improve the quality of services they receive
<i>Disability Services Regulation 2006 (Qld)</i>	<p>Contains detailed information that makes the Act operational. It specifies some requirements for funded non-government service providers, outlining how they must operate to provide the disability services they are funded to deliver.</p> <p>There are three parts to the Regulation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Part 1: Preliminary • Part 2: Prescribed requirements • Part 3: Other matters (identification documents for criminal history screening, and records).
<i>Education (Work Experience) Act 1996 (Qld)</i>	Details legal requirements of agreement between a student's educational establishment and a work experience placement provider, under which the student participates in activities in the workplace as a non-assessable component of their education and training.
Electrical Safety Regulation 2013 (Qld)	Details requirements for service work or office work e.g. specified electrical equipment, safety switches, including portable safety switches.
Environmental Planning & Assessment Regulations (2010) (NSW)	Stipulates that all essential fire safety measures must be maintained and demands that an Annual Fire Safety Statement (AFSS) be prepared by a building's owner or their agent and submitted to the respective governing authority. An AFSS certifies that a building's fire safety measures have been assessed by a qualified person and were found capable of performing as intended to their original design standard.
<i>Environmental Protection Act 1994 (Qld)</i>	Places a general environmental duty on all persons to protect Queensland's environment while allowing for ecologically sustainable development.
Environmental Protection Regulation 2008 (Qld)	Provides a series of low-level offences for noise, dust, odour, fumes, ash, light and smoke nuisances. The Regulations provide for environmental nuisance complaints to be made to the EPA, which may issue a noise abatement notice if the noise is an environmental nuisance.
<i>Equal Opportunity for Women in the Workplace Act 1999 (Cwlth)</i>	An Act to require certain employers to promote equal opportunity for women in employment, to establish the Equal Opportunity for Women in the Workplace Agency and the office of the Director of Equal Opportunity for Women in the Workplace.
<i>Fair Work Act 2009 (Cwlth)</i>	This act creates a national workplace relations system that is fair to working people, flexible for business and promotes productivity and economic growth.

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<i>Family and Child Commission Act 2014 (Qld)</i>	<p>The <i>Family and Child Commission Act 2014</i> gives effect to the government's response to the accepted recommendations of the Queensland Child Protection Commission of Inquiry. The policy objectives of the Act are to establish the Queensland Family and Child Commission as a new statutory body to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • provide systemic oversight of the child protection system delivered by public sector and publicly funded non-government organisations providing child safety services or support services to families to improve the safety and well being of children and young people, including those in need of protection; • drive best practice in the provision of services to this cohort, including by developing a workforce development strategy, coordinating a research program, and by evaluating the performance at a systemic level; • promote and advocate to families and communities their responsibility for protecting and caring for their children including through education and providing information to enhance community awareness.
<i>Fire and Rescue Service Act 1990 (Qld)</i>	Details obligations related to evacuation, fire safety installations, fire safety management plans

<i>Guardianship and Administration Act 2000 (Qld)</i>	An Act to consolidate, amend and reform the law relating to the appointment of guardians and administrators to manage the personal and financial affairs of adults with impaired capacity, to confer jurisdiction on the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal for particular purposes, to create an office of Public Advocate, and for other purposes.

<i>Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979 (NSW)</i>	The objects of the Act are to prevent cruelty to animals, and to promote the welfare of animals by requiring a person in charge of an animal to provide care for the animal, to treat the animal in a humane manner, and to ensure the welfare of the animal.

<i>Public Guardian Act 2014 (Qld)</i>	<p>The <i>Public Guardian Act 2014</i>:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • establishes the role of the Public Guardian, an independent statutory body, reporting to the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice; • transfers refocused child guardian functions including child advocacy and visit functions from the Commission for Children and Young People and Child Guardian to the Public Guardian; • transfers the functions and powers of the Adult Guardian, including for the community visitor program, to the Public Guardian and consequently abolish the position of Adult Guardian; and • makes consequential amendments to the <i>Child Protection Act 1999</i>, <i>Commission for Children and Young People and Child Guardian Act 2000</i>, <i>Guardianship and Administration Act 2000</i> and other Queensland legislation to support the above policy objectives.
<i>Public Health (Tobacco) Act 2008 (NSW)</i>	Aims to reduce the incidence of smoking and other consumption of tobacco products and non-tobacco smoking products, particularly by young people. <u>Smoking in cars</u> with a child under the age of 16 years in the vehicle is an offence under this Act.
<i>Public Interest Disclosures Act 1994 (NSW)</i>	Encourages and facilitates the disclosure of corrupt conduct, maladministration, serious and substantial waste and failures to properly fulfil functions under the <i>Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009 (GIPA Act)</i> in the public sector.
<i>Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal 2009 (Qld)</i>	This Act establishes the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal (QCAT) which has jurisdiction to make decisions in relation to people with impaired capacity, such as the appointment of a guardian under the GAA Act.
<i>Racial Discrimination Act 1975 (Cwlth)</i>	<p>Grounds of unlawful discrimination:</p> <p>Race, colour, descent or national or ethnic origin.</p> <p>Other unlawful conduct</p> <p>Racial hatred</p> <p>Areas covered: Employment; provision of goods and services; right to join trade unions;</p>

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	access to places and facilities; land, housing and other accommodation.

<i>Sex Discrimination Act 1984 (Cwlth)</i>	Protects people from dsicrimination
<i>Smoke-free Environment Act 2000 (NSW)</i>	Bans smoking in enclosed public places and certain outdoor public areas. Includes ban on smoking with children in a car.
<i>Spam Act 2003 (Cwlth)</i>	The Spam Act 2003 prohibits the sending of spam, which is identified as a commercial electronic message sent without the consent of the addressee via email, short message service (SMS), multimedia message service (MMS) or instant messaging. The requirements under the Spam Act apply to all commercial electronic messages, including both bulk and individual messages.
<i>Tobacco and Other Smoking Products Act 1998 (Qld)</i>	Bans smoking in enclosed public places and certain outdoor public areas and a a ban on smoking in cars where children under the age of 16 years are present.
Transport Operations (Road Use Management—Road Rules) Regulation 2009 (Qld)	Details road rules for Queensland.
<i>Trustee and Guardian Act 2009 (NSW)</i>	Trustee and Guardian (NSWTG) can be made the financial manager if there is no one else willing or able to make decisions.
<i>Vocational Education Training and Employment Act 2000 (Qld)</i>	Details the legal requirements for nationally recognised traning and vocational placement
<i>Whistleblowers Protection Act 1994 (Qld)</i>	Protects staff who report misconduct or maladministration. Under this Act the reporting of misconduct or maladministration is called a 'public interest disclosure'. It is against the law to persecute someone for making a public interest disclosure. Reprisals against whistleblowers occur when others attempt or conspire to harm someone who has made or intends to make a disclosure. As long as whistleblowers have acted in good faith, they are protected against reprisals by the <i>Whistleblowers Protection Act 1994</i> and the <i>Crime and Misconduct Act 2001</i> . These Acts make it illegal to victimise anyone making a public interest disclosure.
<i>Work Health and Safety Act</i>	The main object of this Act is to provide for a balanced and nationally consistent framework

<i>Work Health and Safety Act 2011(Qld)</i>	Provides a framework to protect the health, safety and welfare of all workers at work. It also protects the health and safety of all other people who might be affected by the work.
