Hi Janet,

As discussed today, Royce Comber was contacted by us last Friday to discuss his ongoing employment. It was explained to him that after the CEO and Executive Management reviewed the allegations and his response, and after his Working with Children and Criminal Record Checks returned clear, that due to concerns both the Organisation and he had in him working with the client, we would look to place him in employment in the future in alternative services. At this stage the Organisation is unsure of what is available however as soon as something become available we would let him know.

This is to ensure that the risk of the client/family coming in contact with Royce at anytime is reduced and to protect him from further allegations or complaints, also reducing the risk to the organisation. Royce pointed out in his interview that this risk was high if he remained employed and acknowledged this when notified this time.
