On even date I called at the Salvation Army Home for Boys, Indooroopilly, to interview a number of boys who are inmates of that Home. Included with these boys were some who had recently been transferred from the Salvation Army Home for Boys, Riverview.

When interviewing the boy **RED** **REDACT** he furnished me with the undermentioned informed.

A State ward named **REDACTED** who is in receipt of an Invalid Pension and is an inmate of Riverview called on the Salvation Army Home, Indooroopilly, over the week-end and informed him in conversation that a couple of nights after the school boys were transferred from Riverview to Indooroopilly that he **REDACT** was hit across the head with the handle of a hoe by Sergeant **REDACTE** who is evidently one of the Salvation Army Staff.

REDACT stated that he then left the Institution and called on the Police who took him back to the Institution. The Police questioned Captain **REDACTED** regarding the matter.

It is alleged that **REDACT** is not now at Riverview, but is living with a relative at East Ipswich.

REDACTED **REDACT** also stated that two boys named **REDACTED** and **REDACTED** assaulted Lientenant Wilson, to use **REDACT**'s expression "belted him up".

It is also alleged that a dispute occurred between two other persons at the Home, whose names could not be ascertained, and the result was that one was hit across the head with an axe handle.

Two boys, **REDACTED** and **REDACT** **REDACT** had a fight and that **REDACT** threw a brick which hit Stephen.

REDACT is alleged to have stated that practically all the Farm Boys at Riverview are planing a mass absconding.

I considered that the allegations made were of sufficient importance to make an immediate report.
