

Timeline of Events – C. Haggar

- October 1989: Incident occurred sometime in October 1989
- Friday 29th December 1989: Informed Kerry
- Saturday 30th December 1989: Informed Major Les Strong (Divisional Commander)
- Monday 1st or Tuesday 2nd January 1990: Personal interview with Divisional Commander at REDACT
- Sometime in the 1st week of January 1990: Personal interview with Commissioner Bob Bath (Territorial Commander) at Bathurst.
- 2nd week of January 1990: Received confirmation that both mine and my wife's officership was to be terminated and asked to vacate REDA quarters by around 14th February 1990. Arrangements made for personal effects to be picked up and delivered to Bondi Junction where the Army accommodated us for eleven months.
- Mid to late February 1990: Commenced working as an employee in one of the Army's inner city male accommodation social service centres. Worked here for five-six months until obtained employment elsewhere.
- March 1990: Commenced counselling sessions with Peter Farthing of The Salvation Army Counselling Service at Majors Bay Road, Concord. Continued these sessions monthly until the end of the year and possibly also into the following year (to the best of my recollection).
- Early to mid 1990: Attended the Parramatta Police Station with James Condon to report crime to police. The police advised that unless the victim of the crime filed a complaint that they would not pursue the matter as it may cause greater trauma to the victim to do so.
- Mid 1990: Underwent special prayer-counselling organised by James with a gentleman at Strathfield.
- I believe that also during this time I was referred, by Peter Farthing, to and had a number of sessions with, a Salvationist psychiatrist, Dr Herb Smartt at his consulting rooms in the grounds of Rozelle Hospital.
- August 1992: Wrote to Lt-Colonel James Martin (Personnel Secretary) asking to be considered for re-admission to officership. Lt-Colonel Martin was away from office but when Commissioner Bob Bath (who was still Territorial Commander) became aware of my letter, he contacted me and asked me to attend an interview with him.
- Within the following month I think I was asked to attend possibly two sessions with an independent psychiatrist in the city who was asked to provide the Army with a report concerning my likelihood to re-offend. I cannot recall the name of this psychiatrist and I never saw any reports from him.
- October/November 1992: Received notification from the Army that Kerry and I were to be appointed to Riverview Gardens, an aged care centre in Queensland, as assistant officers in January 1993. The Divisional Commander for South Queensland at that time was Major Les Strong.
- January 1993: Resumed officership.
