In many ways it is sad that this has had to occur. For me it has been a time of deep reflection and also a time of coming to grips with a past that was at times traumatic and dehumanising. Through it all though I have learned lessons on trust and also achieved closure. I have also learned that there are people who care and who do have ethics and principles that they adhere to.

Thank you for your work in this ongoing saga. As I've said previously it must be a difficult time for you as you become aware of the ways that so many of us were treated. You must also feel betrayed by some of the officers who didn't exhibit their Christian principles and moral code of behaviour.

There may be more questions that Peter will have in regards to X11, and so I am prepared to answer any concerns that he may have. I know that it is a difficult situation when an officer's actions bring them into disrepute, but I am sure that Peter will be able to handle it with tact and sensitivity.

Again, thank you for your work in settling my claim.
