Colonel Jessop asked for FT [redacted]'s address so I phoned FT [redacted] and explained that the Chief Secretary had retired and now Colonel Jessop wanted to send him a letter.

FT [redacted] talked to me for a while and agreed to give his address. He asked to tell the Colonel that "he would like his life back". He realises that it is impossible but that is what he would really like.

He says he is not against the Salvation Army but what some of the people did.

FT [redacted] is seeing a psychiatrist soon and thinks he will agree to take medication to help his anger and aggression. He has tried to avoid drugs but thinks he needs the extra help of medication. He is on sickness benefits and finds it frustrating because he is used to working long days as a truck driver. He says he gets very violent and it would not be safe for him to be on the road. He blames his violence from a time when he was at Bexley and says Captain McIver threw him onto the concrete and he landed on his head. He says he does not know what he would do if he came face to face with John McIver.

It was his birthday last Saturday and said he had been drinking and three men travelling on the bus gave him a hard time. A fight started which he wanted to continue when he left the bus, but the others declined. He said they could see "he was on the borderline of schizophrenic".

FT [redacted] talked about his two broken relationships and the children involved. He has a son and daughter, twins about two years old who live with their mother in REDAC. He has access every second week but has about seven hours travelling to get there, if the trains are on time. He says he only has about five hours with them before he has to return. Last time he went the twins were sick and he brought them up to the Children's Hospital at Westmead.

He has a six year old son at Campbelltown who is undergoing counselling because of traumas in his life.

FT [redacted] said that his court case with Laurie Wilson will be on September 19. He says the next people to be charged will be John McIver (Major), and X17 [redacted].
