



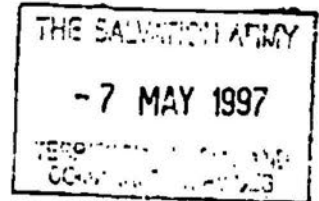

RE: L. WILSON COURT CASE

I was called to give evidence this morning and I was questioned for about an hour. Some of it was about the Inmates Registers for Goulburn and Bexley, but mainly about the conversations I have had with EP and FT. Most of these were over the telephone and notes that I had taken during those calls were taken as evidence and copied. I told the Magistrate they were confidential notes and I was concerned about how many people would see them, so the Magistrate only ordered one copy be made for the Court and only the Prosecuting and Defence Council to see them.

FV also gave evidence today.

My original notes and the Inmates Registers for Goulburn and Bexley have been returned, and the Bexley Punishment Book and the Bexley History Book will be returned later.

Detective Andrew McLean returned the Registers at about 3pm this afternoon and told me that the matter was going to proceed to the District Court. Lawrence Wilson will have to appear in court on June 6 for his plea. If he pleads not guilty dates will be set for the hearings later in the year. Detective McLean will keep me informed about dates.

They have allowed us have the records back as I said that I need to use them but it is possible they will subpoena other records before the next trial.
