


INTERVIEW WITH MAJORS DON & REDACTED SCHULTZ
18th February 2005

Majors Don & Marlene Schultz served with Laurie Wilson at Indooroopilly. They said they had great distrust of him. Don said he thought he was the "devil incarnate". He would do anything to further his own ends. He was a most brutal man. He recalled an occasion when Wilson was using binoculars to spy on the boys. He saw one about to run away. He went down and brutally mistreated the boy, punching and strapping him. It went on and on. Schultz stood up to the boy on that occasion.

Schultz can recall a time when Wilson made a great fuss of needing to bring in witnesses when dealing with boys. He was brought in on one occasion when Wilson asked the boy to lower his pants and did a "medical examination" of the boy's genitals, asking the boy to cough etc.

Apparently Wilson presented himself as having medical training and would wear a stethoscope.
