I desire to point out that the Institution is visited in regard to children under 7 yrs. of age only. There were five children under 7 yrs. accommodated in 1955 when the Matron stated there was "really no accommodation for under 7's as it was not their usual custom to take them".

Since that date there were no children under 7 years. On several occasions when visit by C.W.O. was due, and at time of last trip one such child was in residence.
