The organisation has now considered the options in relation to the claims of Mr Rundle, and we would like to follow options 1 and 3 outlined on page three of your letter.

That is:

do nothing unless Mr Rundle complains to the police, and then await the outcome of any police investigation.
make no offers, and see whether Mr Rundle commences litigation.

As indicated in my earlier e-mail to you on 4 March, we feel there is little point in making a counter offer whilst there is such a huge difference between what Mr Rundle's legal advisers are asking, and what you have assessed as a negotiating range.
