I have forwarded some slides at the end of this email which were provided by Corrs Sydney on Friday afternoon, at a teleconference that I was not able to attend.

The slides include reference to the Rundle case etc - and Corrs are offering again to discuss these issues with our legal team.

Dear Colonel

Is there any particular reason that this case cannot be settled out of Court? We are concerned about this going to Court and the publicity it will create and other ramifications for the The Salvation Army in Australia.

Nearly all our abuse claims have been settled out of Court. It is hard to understand why Rundle would want to take it to Court when an out of court agreed settlement amount could well see him receive a greater amount by taking it out of Court and avoiding the cost of legal fees etc.

Our approach has been for senior leadership to meet with those seeking payment for abuse claims and in light of this we are wondering if your good self or Commissioner James Knaggs has met with him to try and bring about a settlement.

I reiterate at this end we are concerned about the publicity and ramifications of this court case.

It is possible that Corrs have been commenting on the running of the Rundle case by our Territory, and this is upsetting the Eastern Territory which, as we found out again recently, seems quite willing to throw large sums of money to claimants to avoid court action.

It would be helpful if you are able to:

- summarise the offer of compromise, and when it was put.
- comment on whether it is possible, or desirable, for TSA itself to make direct contact with Rundle and further attempt to resolve the matter.
- the potential impact on the current proceedings.
- comment on any other aspects that ought be covered in or reply.
