Statement of events.

on 20/8/1970 I was charged by police for larceny as a servent and was given 3 years probation. The probation officer assigned to was salvation brig wally bryant.

During that term of probation I thought mr bryant was a nice man but found a devious nature to him as far as sexual advances.

I was in fear of him as the advances seemed to intensify each appointment like groveling, the running of his hand up my inner leg, the suggestions that he liked me very much and wants to know me more, the attempts to kiss me and the touching of my buttock every time he could. despite protests he continued with this and even followed me to the toilet at one time and exposed his penis to me asking me to play with it.

It was at this stage I knew I had to do something and was in fear of breaching my probation as mr Bryant made it clear that if I did not keep appointments I would go to jail.

Knowing that I fled to King Island for 3 years hoping that I would not be found and that by fleeing I was breaking probation.

on the 11/6/1971 my probation was breached for non attendance.

This added another criminal charge to my record.

This action cost me my family and my job at the time being repco auto parts and it has also been bought to my attention that should I have not left repco I would have my own store now.

It also made me lose trust in the authorities and felt that my only choice was to flee. thats about it but let me say that it has haunted me over many years since learning that mr bryant is deceased now but I still hold someone responsible for his actions. Let me say I dont hate Mr Bryant but hate what he did and what his actions cost.

I am trying to put my demons to rest as I know I can not go through life without doing that and getting answers
