I am very surprised that Bryant has not before been suspected of any other offences and that I was the only one as his actions suggested different or perhaps other victims did not come forward as we know is generally the case.


I ask for the salvation to accept this and an make good their remorse for this happening. I question the dept of justice also for not screening probation officers but in this case had no reason to suspect Bryant
