The Salvation Army – Bayswater Boys' Home

I am writing on behalf of The Salvation Army to express deep regret for any mistreatment you suffered during your stay at the Bayswater Boys' Home whilst in the care of The Salvation Army.

I have been provided with a copy of your statement and the report of Joan Callahan.

I wish to express The Salvation Army's apology for the physical, sexual and emotional abuse which you have described.

Like many institutions and churches, The Salvation Army has in more recent years been dealing with victims of abuse that have occurred in institutions. We have been attempting to deal with such complaints in a caring and compassionate way.

I apologise to you. You were placed in the care of The Salvation Army which was a position of trust. Unfortunately, The Salvation Army appears to have betrayed that trust.

Clearly, what you say happened should not have happened. There is no justification for mistreatment and abuse. The Salvation Army has never condoned it in the past, nor do they condone it now.

I am heartened that after so many years you have been able to tell your story hopefully, in the telling, you may have gained some comfort. I am also pleased that you have been able to recount your story to Mr Philip Brewin of Nevett Ford lawyers representing The Salvation Army.
