**Royal Commission into Institutional Responses to Child Sexual Abuse (the Commission):
 Case Study 33: The Salvation Army (Southern Territory)**

We refer to:

1. our letter dated 26 October 2015, regarding the question Mr Philip Brewin, from Nevett Ford, took on notice, about the provision of documents about Mr Osborne's admission to Mr Trevor Walker, during the public hearing in Adelaide for Case Study 33; and
2. your letter dated 4 November 2015, in which you state that the question Mr Brewin took on notice during the public hearing was as follows:

The question Mr Brewin took on notice was whether the document at tab 384 recording Mr Osborne's admission was provided to Mr Walker for the preparation of his report. Please let us know whether the document was provided to Mr Walker.

It is our understanding (and that of Mr Brewin) that the question Mr Brewin took on notice during the hearing was whether *he or anyone else at Nevett Ford*, directly passed on to Mr Walker documents and files relating to Mr Osborne's admission, which include the document at tab 384 of the tender bundle. We consider that the transcript of the public hearing extracted in our letter dated 26 October 2015 and in your letter dated 4 November 2015, supports our understanding.

We consider that the last paragraph of our letter dated 26 October 2015 provides an answer to that question. In addition, Mr Brewin confirms that no-one else at Nevett Ford provided the document at tab 384 to Mr Walker.
