

1. In accordance with arrangements made, the Salvation Army "Seaforth" Boys' Industrial School, Gosnells, closed on 10.8.55.
2. Following this, the Salvation Army authorities decided to transfer the lads cared for in the General Section of "Seaforth" to their institution at Nedlands and this move took place on 30.8.55. I had discussed the position with Senior Major Robertson, the State Men's Social Secretary, The Salvation Army, and I was in full agreement with the proposal to move wards of the Department to the Salvation Army Boys' Home, Nedlands.
3. I recommend that the Executive Council approve of the discontinuance of the Salvation Army "Seaforth" Boys' Industrial School as a subsidised institution (industrial school) as from 10.8.55 and the Salvation Army "Seaforth" Boys' Home (No. 2 Section) as from 30.8.55. This action is taken in accordance with Section 14 (2) of the Child Welfare Act, 1947 - 1952.
