

Point No. 3: I think it is a splendid idea that no final decisions be made until you have a chance to talk to Paul here in America in September. At the same time I shall be glad to speak with you. At least, I think it would be a good idea to give Paul by mail an agenda for your meeting; i.e., some idea of the options opened to him; (a) come back to Australia; (b) go to Europe under supervision; and (c) remain in America.

Point No. 4: I do not see the wisdom of his remaining in America. First of all he cannot remain without the letter but he refuses to allow you to say anything to the Bishop of Richmond. Again he wants to know whether he is acceptable in his own country and staying too long away from Australia may give him the idea that he is not wanted.

Obviously I am not making any copy of this letter for Paul.
